See the secretary's email about advance payment for the indoor 2015/2016 indoor season.

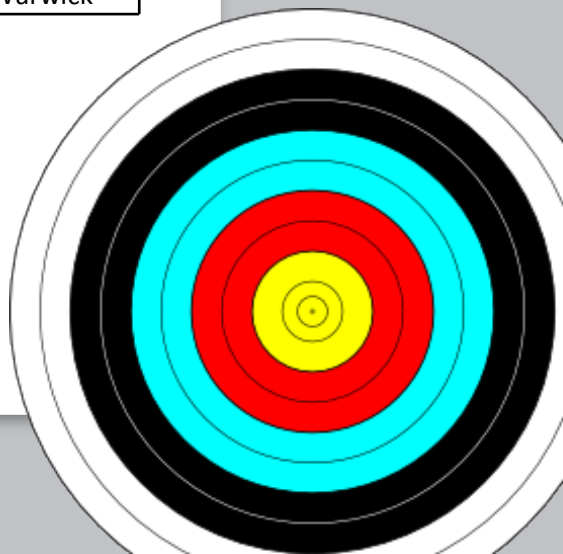

Dear Val,
Does the overall weight of my recurve bow make a difference to shooting?

Dear Eva

The answer to this question is rather more complicated than you might think. I assume by 'overall weight' you mean the mass weight. Once you are at full draw the mass weight is counteracted by the draw weight. If the bow is very heavy you could be wasting energy just handling it which could tire you out by the time you have shot five or six ends. That is certainly going to affect your shooting. Having said that, a light bow is more likely to move in the wind but easier to bring back into line. If you feel it is too heavy then it probably is. It is also possible that stabiliser weight and/or position can affect the feel of the bow.

County Badges

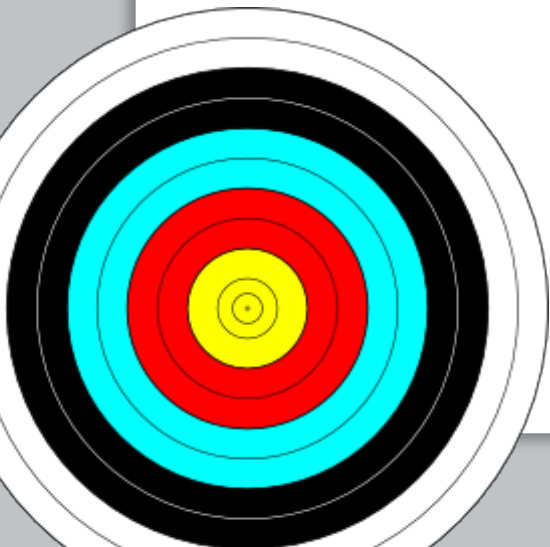
When you reach 1st, 2nd or 3rd class, you are presented with a pin badge to recognise this.
