Thank you to everyone who supported us with indoor shooting which will enable us to keep the venue for our move back after the outdoor season ends in October.

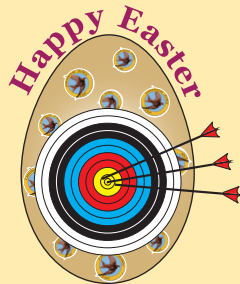
The County Championship was well attended by our archers, very well done to all who entered and of course to those who came back with medals.

## SUN PROTECTION IN SPORT

As the weather warms up, many of us are eager to shed our woollens and soak up the sun. When you're at the field for hours on end, it can be easy to forget the impact of UV exposure as you focus on the target.



### TOP TIPS TO REMEMBER

- UV radiation cannot be seen or felt, so check the UV Index daily, and use sun protection when it reads 3 or over.
- A short training session can last for hours, so get into the habit of being sun prepared before you start any outdoor activity.
- Sunscreen can wear, wash, rub or sweat off, so reapply every two hours or more often when around water.
- To avoid a greasy grip, use a sunscreen applicator or clean palms with a small towel and alcohol gel.
- When removing clothing on a warm day, remember to apply sunscreen to all newly exposed areas of skin.

15 archers have shot rounds in the L&R 300

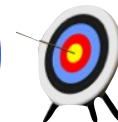

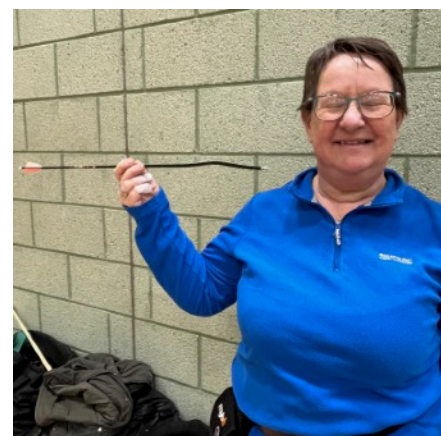

## LAC ARCHERS AT THE COUNTY INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIP



The Indoor County Championships were hosted by KMAC on 8th Feb 8 LAC archers entered.  
**Well done to everyone especially those who came back with medals.**

*Charles has kindly written a step by step account as to what happens at these championships, thank you Charles for your time coaching our archers in readiness for the championships, guiding them through the procedures, looking after them and of course writing this article.*

**The County Indoors Championship** comes around quicker each year. A Portsmouth shoot was held at Kirby Muxloe club's venue in Groby.

We were represented by eight LAC members, with Tom and Richard shooting for the first time at such an event.

This Portsmouth shoot consisted of 3 sessions with 9 bosses, each with 4 archers, which means there were nearly 100 archers shooting approximately 6,500 arrows over the course of the day. Only the Battle of Agincourt can beat that, with an estimated arrows count of 250,000.

I have lost count of how many of these competitions I have attended, but they all seem to end up in the same way, a good natter with both old and new acquaintances. Archery does seem to be secondary, and this means you are more at ease.

I have spoken with a few of the LAC attendees and all said how much they enjoyed it and how much easier it is to shoot consistently when you only shoot three arrow ends.

Shoots, such as this, are far more regimented, controlling when you can approach the line, when you can shoot, when you can collect, how the scoring is carried out and so on. Let me run through my shoot:

- 7:45am left home
- 8:15am arrived at venue  
signed in, remembering to show my AGB membership card. (no card, no shoot)  
setup my bow  
found the target I was shooting on  
got a cup of tea
- 8:30am judge looks at my bow and my arrows to make sure I am safe to shoot, and my equipment conforms to the regulations  
chatted with an old friend  
greeted the other LAC archers
- 8:55am pre-shoot chat by shoot organiser  
pre-shoot chat by judges
- 9:00am here we go  
I was on target 2A, so shot my first three arrows with archer on 2B  
waited whilst 2C and 2D shot their three arrows  
collected the arrows  
waited whilst 2C and 2D shot their next three arrows  
shot my next set of three arrows with 2B  
collected the arrows...and so on  
in between ends chatted with whoever was standing near by
- 11:30am finished shooting  
checked the scoresheet  
shook hands with archers on target boss 2  
packed my gear away
- 11:45am found the other LAC archers, and all said did not shoot well, but enjoyed it all the same  
went home

So, other than taking two and a half hours to shoot the Portsmouth round, it is very similar to a club Portsmouth, you shoot arrows, score and chat.

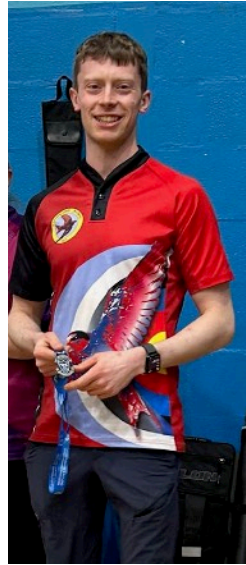
Those who shot this year from LAC were Clare, Meg, Andrew, James, Jeremy, Richard, Tom and myself.

You may think it is daunting to enter such a competition, but as you are new to the event, you will be competing against yourself and your personal best, unless your scores are already high as the winning female recurve score which was 560 and the open recurve score was 582. So, why enter? It's because you are trying to improve yourself and it's an opportunity to meet and chat with other people with a common interest. Hope that gives you an idea of how things are run.

## Did you know?

### HOW TO AIM A BOW WITHOUT A SIGHT

**Draw the string to the corner of your mouth.**

*This is called an anchor point and while archers with a sight draw to their jaw, you should touch your index/middle finger to the corner of your mouth. This brings the arrow closer to your eye and allows you to aim with greater accuracy.*

# FARMING EXPERIENCE

Last year on a couple of occasions Cliff and I helped inoculate some cattle with Marcus and Sam.

On Tuesday 10th March we helped again inoculating 95 or so yearling cattle on the farm. The four of us have a good routine working initially to move them from their current indoor shelter to the barn where they can be separated and treated.

Cliff and I are carefully watched over by Marcus and Sam. The cattle receive three treatments to protect against lung worm, black leg and Leptospirosis. Marcus gives a dose to the animal's mouth by a small individual bottle and Cliff and I administer the injections.

In two weeks, we will be repeating the process and then after the cattle are checked for pregnancy they will be allowed out into the fields.
